

Itinerary

Day 1 Arrival.

Arrive independently from 15.00 at Mercure Caledonian Hotel, Aberdeen. This evening we will enjoy a welcome drink and dinner at the hotel.

Day 2 Old Aberdeen and City Centre.

We spend today exploring Old Aberdeen, as the name suggests, one of the oldest parts of the city and a separate town from 1499 to 1891. The stunning architecture showcases a range of eras ranging from medieval to Georgian and Victorian buildings. We start our tour at Kings College Chapel, the oldest building of Kings College and the symbolic centre of the University of Aberdeen. After lunch (own expense) we visit Aberdeen Art Gallery which is home to one of the finest collections in Scotland spanning 700 years, and the Maritme Museum to follow the story of Aberdeen's maritime heritage. Later we drive to Thainstone House Hotel, a beautiful 18th century country house with rolling countryside views.

Day 3 Fyvie Castle, Pitmedden Garden and ice cream.

This morning we drive to Mackies of Scotland and their farm in Westertown, where their famous dairy ice cream is made. Our tour includes a walk through the arboretum and the opportunity to buy an



ice-cream, if it's not too early in the day for you! Next we visit the magnificent fortress of Fyvie Castle, with its Baronial architecture and Walled Garden. The fine collection is spread across five towers and includes antiquities, armour, and a stunning collection of art. This afternoon we visit Pitmedden Garden, a re-created Scottish Renaissance garden dating from 1685, with parterres edged by almost 6 miles of hedging and sculptures, flower borders, a herb garden and Museum of Farming Life.

Day 4 Leith Hall, Knockando Woolmill and whisky tasting.

17th century Leith Hall was donated to the NTS by the Leith-Hay family who lived there from 1650 until just after World War II. Our guided tour this morning follows the family's changing taste over the centuries, including some quirky items, and a military exhibition. In the grounds, the Rock Garden is the Trust's highest altitude garden, at 600 feet above sea level, offering spectacular views. Next stop is Spey Valley and 230-year-old working woolmill Knockando. We wind the day up with a visit to the oldest distillery in Speyside, Strathisla Distillery with its beautiful riverside setting. Here we take a guided tour, finishing with whisky-tasting.

Day 5 Crathes Castle and Stonehaven.

Alexander Burnett built Crathes Castle in the 16th century, a classic Scottish tower with an intricate maze of turrets, towers, oak panels and painted ceilings. The glorious gardens include a historic walled garden with yew hedges planted as early as 1702, and the recently-redesigned Rose Garden.

Our final visit is to the pretty harbour town of Stonehaven, busy with sailing boats. On the quayside, the Tolbooth Museum has a fascinating history as a former courthouse and jail. After passing the dramatic ruins of Dunnottar Castle, we return to the hotel for our final group dinner.

Day 6 Departure.

Departure from the hotel with drop-offs at the airport and railway station for onward travel home.


Where you stay
